LCSD Early Dismissal Drills


LHS Seniors Honored by National Merit Program

Liverpool High School Executive Principal Brett Woodcock recently announced that senior Matthew LaCombe has been named a Semifinalist in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program (NMSP), while seniors Ayane Dela Cruz and Will Rosenfield have been named Commended Students in the program.



LaCombe is one out of approximately 16,000 students who received a Semifinalist designation in recognition of their outstanding academic promise, according to the National Merit Scholarship Program Web site. LaCombe will advance in the contest for National Merit Scholarship awards.

Dela Cruz and Rosenfield are two out of approximately 34,000 students who received Letters of Commendation in recognition of their outstanding academic promise, according to the National Merit Scholarship Program Web site.



The National Merit Scholarship Corporation, which sponsors the NMSP, is a not-for-profit organization established in 1955. High school students enter by taking the PSATs and by meeting published entry/participation requirements.

Helpful Transportation Tips for Dealing with the Upcoming Winter Weather

As Central New York prepares for winter weather here are some helpful reminders for Liverpool Central School District parents and guardians.

During inclement weather, there are many factors that affect our buses and it is not uncommon for buses to run a few minutes late.

Parents can keep track of their child's school bus through the Traversa Ride 360 app, which allows them to access their own secure data for bus stop location, route, and pick-up time.

Each Liverpool bus is now equipped with Tyler Drive GPS, and Ride 360 can use the GPS geolocation to let users know when to expect their bus each day and provide the district real-time data to enhance the safety and security of all students during transport.

Students still need to be at the bus stop on time, even in the coldest of weather. If the students are not out, the bus cannot wait because that would delay the route for everyone else. Please also have your child dressed appropriately for the weather.

If schools are delayed or closed, that information is posted on the LCSD Web site (www.liverpool.k12.ny.us) immediately, usually before 6 a.m., and announced using the ParentSquare (e-mail and text message) service.

It is important that your contact information is up-to-date in our student information system so that you can receive notices from ParentSquare in the event school is closed, delayed or dismissed early. Please contact your school building if your contact information has changed.

In addition, local television stations will announce the delays or closings live on TV and on their Web sites.

No matter what the weather please remember that if you encounter a school bus with its red lights flashing you must stop. There will be children entering or exiting the bus... let's keep them safe!





Additional Information...

On certain rare occasions, emergency conditions, such as impending storms, may necessitate dismissal of students before regular school closing time.

In such an event, efforts will be made to have the emergency closing posted on the Web site and announced via ParentSquare and local television stations.

Partial Day (After 12:00): K through Grade 12 - NO activities involving students will be permitted.

Full Day: K through Grade 12 - Practices, rehearsals and meetings involving students WILL NOT BE permitted.

Full Day: Grades 9 through 12 - Competitions and performances involving students MAY BE permitted at the discretion of the principal, the director of athletics or the director of fine arts.



ent Portal/Grades Tab by clicking on the Printer icon. Parents or guardians who do not have access to the Internet can contact their child's school to request that a paper copy is sent home.

Liverpool CSD Chosen to Participate in NYS Weight Status Study

As part of a required school health examination, a student is weighed and his/her height is measured. These numbers are used to figure out the student's body mass index or 'BMI'. The BMI helps the doctor or nurse know if the student's weight is in a healthy range or is too high or too low. Recent changes to the New York State Education Law require that BMI and weight status group be included as part of the student's school health examination.

Every year a sample of New York's school districts are selected to participate in a survey conducted by the New York State Department of Health. The Liverpool Central School District is one of the districts chosen to participate in the study. The district will be reporting to New York State Department of Health information about students' weight

status groups in January 2024.

Only summary information is provided. No names and no information about individual students is shared. The information sent to the New York State Department of Health will help health officials develop programs that make it easier for children to be healthier.

Parents and guardians may choose to have a child's information excluded from this survey report. Those who do not wish to have their child's weight status group information included as part of the New York State Health Department's survey this year, can download the district's opt out form online at www.liverpool.k12.ny.us/news/1773208/nys-weight-status-student. Fill out the form and sign, then return this form to the child's school nurse no later than December 1, 2023.



LCSD Participates in Pajamarama

In October, Liverpool Central School District students and staff once again participated in a friendly competition involving some of its biggest rivals!

Paige's Pajamarama is a charity event that allows students and staff to wear their pajamas to school when making a donation. Funds raised benefit Paige's Butterfly Run, Inc., an organization which supports children with pediatric cancer at Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital.

The annual event began in 2019, when Cicero-North Syracuse High School students challenged Liverpool High School students to see who could raise more money for Paige's Pajamarama.

Since then, the event has grown to include schools throughout each district, as well as neighboring school districts West Genesee CSD, Fayetteville-Manlius CSD, Baldwinsville CSD and East Syracuse Minoa CSD.

This year, two more districts – Jordan Elbridge and Phoenix CSD joined the Pajamarama competition.




LHS Athletic Hall Holds Induction Ceremony


Four individuals and two teams recently were inducted into the Liverpool High School Athletic Hall of Fame.


